Students will understand what to do if they receive a phishing email or text message.

Specific information for this task: Log in to the Extra Practice Activity on each student computer before beginning. Language skills: You are not assessing language skills. If the students do not remember vocabulary in the task instructions or the digital skills checklist, explain it to them again.









