## Say to the learner:

Before applying for a job, it's good to learn a bit about the company. You can do that by watching videos on YouTube.

Many companies have videos on YouTube.

So, we're going to review how to use YouTube.

# [Part One]

- First, we're going to review how to search for YouTube in the browser
- Then, how to search for videos on YouTube

# [Part Two]

Later we'll look at how to navigate on a YouTube channel. To "Navigate on a website" means to move around on the website to find different things.

# [Part Three]

And another day, we'll look at how to use "Playlists" as well as to search for all the videos on a YouTube channel

# [Part Four]

We'll also look at different functions in YouTube like turning up the volume, making the video full screen and using closed captions.

### YouTube Video Search-Part One

### Instructions for the Tutor

These are the skills the learner will master at the end of the lesson:

- Search for YouTube in the browser
- Search for Videos on YouTube

### Say to the learner:

- First, we're going to review how to search for YouTube in the browser
- Then, how to search for videos on YouTube



#### YouTube Video Search-Part One

### Say to the Learner:

Let's review how to <u>Search for YouTube in the browser</u> and then how to <u>Search for videos on YouTube</u>.

We'll watch a video to review how to do this.

We can watch the video several times. So, don't worry if you don't catch everything the first time.

### Instructions for the Tutor:

- •The icon in the slide with the red triangle is a link to the video on YouTube.
- Just click on that link (in Slideshow mode) to open the video LESSON.
- •Here is that link in case the one in the slide doesn't work:



# [Why use YouTube when looking for a Job]

 You want to work for a certain company. What can you find on YouTube to help you?

**Answer:** Videos about the company, for example, Save on Foods. They can help you learn about the company.

# [Find YouTube]

• What do you do first when you want to go on YouTube? **Answer:** Open

the browser

 After opening the browser, what do you do next to find YouTube/ the YouTube website?

**Answer**: Use the search bar or address bar

 Can you use the search bar <u>or</u> the address bar to look for YouTube (and other websites) using Google?

Answer: Yes, you can use either.

- Show me the search bar.
- Show me the icon / symbol of the search bar

### [Use the Search Bar in the Browser]

How do you use the search bar?

#### Answer:

- Click in the search box
- Type the name (or words for what you are looking for)
- Press Enter on the keyboard (or click on the search icon)

# [Choose from the Search Results in the Browser]

- What do you have to do to see all the results? Answer: Scroll down and up
- You chose one of the results. Now, how do you go to that website? What do you click on?

Answer: Click on either the name or on the website address

• How do you know where to click to go to that website?

**Answer:** The cursor changes to a hand where it is a link.

 How do you know you are on the YouTube website? Answer: You see the YouTube logo and name at the top. (and the website address in the address bar)

# [Search for Videos in YouTube]

How do you search for videos on YouTube?

#### Answer:

- Find the search bar
- Click in the box
- Type the words "Save on Foods" ,or whatever you are looking for
- Press Enter on your keyboard, or click on the Search icon
- Show me the search bar in YouTube.
- What do you need to do to see all the results? Answer: Scroll down (and up)
- In the video, are there many results or a few? **Answer:** many results
- Show me three different search results. Point to them (on the image in the video lesson)

### [Identify who Posted a Video]

 Are videos about Save on Foods only made by the company? Or are some made by other people?

**Answer:** Some are made by the company and some are made by other people

- How do you know which videos are made by the company?
   Answer: you see the logo and name of the company
- You only want to look at the company videos. For example, the videos made by Save on Foods not made by other people. What do you click on ?

**Answer:** Click on the logo /company name

• How do you know where to click, what is a link?

**Answer:** When the cursor becomes a hand, that means it's a link.

### **Instructions for Tutor:**

Then ask the learner: Do you want to watch the video again?

If the learner is struggling, stop the session.

# Say to the learner:

Let's do more work on X before we do this. (so, learner does not feel bad they can't yet do something)

For example, the learner may not be able to recognize cursor shapes or where to place a cursor. If so, go to Module 1 Mouse and Navigating and Module 3 Online Skills Basic etc. to practice the skills with the learner.

- Make sure there is one internet browser icon on the desktop and/ or the taskbar on learner's computer.

### Preparation for Remote tutoring only:

- Show me the icon / symbol of the search bar

# [Use the Search Bar in the Browser]

Now, use the search bar. How do you search for YouTube?

#### Answer:

- Click in the search box
- Type "YouTube
- Press Enter on the keyboard (or click on the search icon)
- Do that now.

# [Choose from the Search Results in the Browser]

- You can see many results. Scroll down to see more.
- Now scroll up again.
- Find the result for YouTube.com
- What do you click on to go to that website? Answer: Click on either the name or the website address
- How do you know where to click? Answer: The cursor changes to a hand where it is a link.
- Do that now.
- Are you on the YouTube website now? How do you know? Answer: Yes,

because you see the YouTube logo and name at the top. (and the website address in the address bar)

• Show that to me.

### [Search for Videos in YouTube]

Do you remember how to search for videos on YouTube?

### Answer:

- Find the search bar
- Click in the box
- Type the words "Save on Foods" (or whatever you are looking for)
- Press Enter on your keyboard, or click on the Search icon
- Do that now.
- Can you see all the results ? If not, scroll down (and up again)
- Show me three different search results. Point to them

## [Identify who Posted a Video]

- Let's look only for videos that were made by Save on Foods (or whatever you are focusing on) What do you look for ? Answer: The logo and name of the company
- Now, go to the YouTube Channel for Save on Foods (or whatever you are focusing on)
- Click on the logo /company name
- How do you know where to click, what is a link? **Answer:** When the cursor becomes a hand, that means it's a link.
- Now you are in the Save on Foods YouTube channel (or whatever channel you are focusing on)
- Great! You practiced how to go to YouTube and started practicing how to search for videos.
- Practice again. Close the website and the browser.
- Now. Start again. Show me how to go to YouTube in the browser.....

### Instructions for the Tutor:

**Practice:** Have the learner repeat the above activity and practice as many times as they need (at least three times.)

### **CHECK THE LEARNER'S SKILLS:**

Has the learner shown you they can do the skills at least three times without support? If so, then they are ready to move on to Part Two.

# Say to the learner:

You practiced how to go to YouTube and how to search for a video on YouTube.



# [Navigate on a YouTube Channel]

- What is a YouTube channel ? Answer: (Not in the video) It's a place on YouTube where a person or a company uploads their videos for others to watch
- You click on a video link. What may happen automatically? Answer: A video may play

# [Pause a Video]

• If a video plays automatically, can you pause it? Answer: Yes, you can

- How can you pause the video? **Answer:** Click on the video screen (or on the pause button) to pause the video
- What does the pause button look like ? **Answer:** Two short vertical lines
- Show me the pause button (on the lesson video image)
- How can you see all of the video results? Answer: Scroll down and up

# [Use the menu]

- What is at the top of the YouTube Channel? **Answer:** A menu
- What words are in the menu? Answer: Home, Videos, Playlists, Community, Channels, About
- Are the words in the menu links? Answer: Yes they are
- How do you know the words in the menu are links? Answer: The cursor changes to a hand

## [See all Videos on a YouTube Channel]

- You want to see all of the videos on one channel. What do you click on?
   Answer: Click on "Videos" in the menu
- Can you see all of them or do you need to scroll down to see them all?
   Answer: You need to scroll down

# [Play a video]

- You chose a video you want to watch. How do you play the video?
   Answer: Click on the name or the (video) picture
- What is good to do while you watch? Answer: Take notes (if it is for a job search etc.)

# [Skip Ads]

- What often plays before the video ? Answer: An ad or Ads
- Do you have to watch the ad or can you skip it? Answer: You can skip it
- Can you skip it right away? Answer: No, usually you can skip it after 5 seconds
- Show me the "Skip Ad" icon
- What happens after you click "Skip Ad"? Answer: The video plays
- How do you pause the video ? Answer: Click on the pause icon (or on the video picture)

# [Go back to the (Save on Foods) YouTube Channel Homepage-Use the Logo/name to go back]


 You can't see the information under the video. What do you do so you can see it?

**Answer:** Scroll down a bit

• You want to go back to the Homepage of the (Save on Foods) YouTube Channel. What do you do?

Answer:

- Find the (Save on Foods) logo or name (under the video)
- Click on it
- You are back at the Homepage of the (Save on Foods) YouTube Channel
- Show me the Save on Foods logo on the Homepage

# [Use the menu]

- Find the menu. (Hint: At the top of the YouTube Channel)
- What words are in the menu? Answer: Home, Videos, Playlists, Community,

- Channels, About
- Are the words in the menu links? **Answer:** Yes they are
- How do you know the words in the menu are links? Answer: The cursor changes to a hand

### [See all Videos on a YouTube Channel]

- You want to see all of the videos on this channel. Do you remember how to do that ? (**Hint**: Click on "Videos" in the menu)
- Can you see all of them or do you need to scroll down to see them all?
- Scroll down now.
- Then scroll up.

### [Play a video]

- Choose a video to watch.
- How do you play the video? Answer: Click on the name or the (video) picture
- Do that now.

# [Skip Ads]

- If an ad plays, pause the video.
- Do you have to watch the ad or can you skip it ? Answer: You can skip it after 5 seconds
- Show me how to skip the ad. (Hint: Click on "Skip Ad" icon)
- The video is playing now.
- Pause the video. (Hint: Click on the pause icon/button (or on the video picture)

# [Go back to the (Save on Foods) YouTube Channel Homepage-Use the logo/name to go back]

 You want to see the information under the video. What do you do so you can see it?

Answer: Scroll down a bit

- Do that now.
- Go back to the Homepage of the (Save on Foods) YouTube Channel now:
  - Find the (Save on Foods) logo or name (under the video)
  - Click on it
  - You are back at the Homepage of the (Save on Foods) YouTube Channel
- Practice again. Close the website and the browser.
- Now. Start again. Show me how to go to YouTube in the browser.....

### Say to the learner:

We practiced how to Navigate on a YouTube channel before. Now, we are going to review how to <u>Search by Playlist Topics on a YouTube</u> Channel

Have you ever done that?

What is a "Playlist"?

**Answer**: A group / list of videos about one topic (For example: Videos about Online shopping, Videos about Healthy Snacks etc.

It's a good way to find videos because they are organized by topic. All the videos about Healthy Snacks are together in one playlist. All the videos

about Online shopping are together in one playlist. Etc.

Most YouTube channels have playlists.



   Answer: Click on the link. The link is the name or the video
- In the example we watched, she opened one playlist. It was called "Ready-Set-Refresh". How many videos were in that playlist? **Answer**: 5 videos

### [Go Back-Use the Back Icon/Button]

- You want to go back. How do you do that? **Answer:** Click on the back icon/button (or click on the company logo and name (For example, Save on Foods)
- Show me where to find the back icon / button.

# [See all Videos on a Channel]

 How do you see all the videos that are on one YouTube Channel (Example, Save on Foods)?

#### Answer:

- Go to the Channel Homepage
- Look at the menu
- Find "Videos" in the menu
- · Click on it
- Then you can the videos
- Can you see all the videos on your screen, or do you have to scroll down to see them all?

Answer: You may need to scroll down (if there are many videos)

# [Play a Video, Pause a Video and Skip Ads on YouTube]

- You choose a video to watch. How do you play it? Answer: Click on the name or the video picture
- It may play automatically. How can you pause it ? Answer: Click on the video picture
- An ad may play. How can you skip it? Answer: Click on "Skip Ad"
- You paused a video. How can you play it again ?

**Answer:** Click on the "Play" icon (or on the video picture)

- Where is the "Play" icon ? **Answer**: In the bottom left corner
- What does the "Play" icon look like ? **Answer:** A triangle pointing to the right



- Go to the Menu
- Find "Playlists"
- Click on "Playlists"
- "Playlists" opens and you can see the different playlists
- What do you do if you can't see all of the playlists? Answer: Scroll down
- Do that now, Scroll down.
- Then scroll up again.

### [View a Full Playlist]

- Let's practice how to open a Playlist to see the videos inside. This is called, "View a Full Playlist".
- In the video we watched, she opened one playlist. It was called "Ready-Set-Refresh".
- Choose a playlist now to open.
- What's the name of the playlist you want to open?
- Click on the link to open it (**Hint:** the video picture or the name/ "View Full Playlist")
- If a video plays automatically, pause it. (**Hint:** Click on the video or on the pause icon)
- How many videos are in that playlist? Scroll down to the bottom to see the full list.
- Then scroll up again.
- Now choose one of the videos to play. How do you play it? **Answer:** Click on the name, or the video picture. Do that now.
- Great! Let's just watch a few seconds then pause it.
- You can watch it later. Remember we are practicing digital skills in YouTube now.

# [Go back]


- Let's go back to the homepage of the Save on Foods channel now.
- Use the back icon/button. Show me how to do that. (If the learner opened a few videos, they will need to click the "Back" icon a few times to get back to the homepage. Guide them to do that)
- Great! Now you are back at the "Playlists" homepage.

Choose another playlist and practice again. (Repeat the above steps)

- Great. We won't look at the video now. We need to practice the digital skills.

# [Search for all Videos on a YouTube Channel]

 So, you are on the YouTube Channel. Now, go to the menu and find "Videos"

- Can you see all the videos? Remember what to do if you can't see them all? Answer: Scroll down
- Do that now, Scroll down
- Then scroll up again.

# [Play a video, Pause a Video and Skip Ads]

- Choose a video to watch.
- Do you remember how to play it? Answer: Click on the name or the video picture
- It may play automatically. Pause it. (Click on the video or on the pause icon)
- An ad may play. How can you skip it? **Answer:** Click on "Skip Ad"
- Do that now.
- So, you paused a video. How can you play it again ?
   Answer: Click on the "Play" icon (or on the video picture)
- Show me the "Play" icon.
- What does the "Play" icon look like ? Answer: A triangle pointing to the right
- Click on it now to play the video.
- Now pause the video again.
- Now play it again.
- Great! Remember you can click on either the pause icon or on the video picture to pause and play the video.

# (Tip: For those who prefer keyboards: You can also press the spacebar on your keyboard.)

Practice again! Repeat the above steps.

### Instructions for the Tutor:

- Have the learner practice as many times as they need (at least three times.)
- Check the Learner's skills. Has the learner shown you they can do the skills
  at least three times without support? If so, then they are ready to move
  on to Part Three.

### Instructions to the Tutor

These are the skills learners will master at the end of the lesson:

- Make the Video Full Screen
- Volume-Turn up/down
- Turn on/ off Closed Captions

### Say to the learner:

We practiced how to Search for Videos by Playlist Topics, how to Search for all Videos on a YouTube Channel. We also practices how to play and pause a video and how to skip ads.

Now, we are going to review how to do a few other functions in YouTube. We'll look at three things:

- 1. How to Make the Video Full Screen
- 2. How to Turn the Volume Up and Down

and

# 3. How to Turn Closed Captions On and Off

Have you done these things before in YouTube? They are all very useful. It's good to know how to do them.



### YouTube Video Search-Part Four

### Say to the Learner:

So, let's review how to do a few functions in YouTube:

- Make the Video Full Screen
- Volume- Turn up/down
- Turn on/ off Closed Captions

We're going to watch a video to review how to do these. We can watch the video several times. So, don't worry if you don't catch everything the first time.

### Instructions for the Tutor:



- Just click on that link (in Slideshow mode) to open the video Lesson.

- For remote tutoring, when you share screen to play the video, make sure you have shared the audio.
- Play the lesson a bit and check the learner can hear it ok.

### **PART FOUR**

### **Check Understanding**

After watching the video lesson, replay the video, pause it and ask questions to check understanding (review and elicit) before moving on to the Practice.

Ask these comprehension check questions or others to check understanding:

# [Make the Video Full Screen]

- Can you make the video large so it covers all of your screen? Answer: Yes, you can
- How do you make a video cover all of your screen ? Answer: Use the "Full Screen" function: Find the "Full Screen" icon. Click on it
- Where is the "Full Screen" icon? **Answer:** In the bottom right corner of the video screen
- What does the "Full Screen" icon look like? Answer: A square with holes on each side
- Sometimes the icons disappear. How can you get the icons again ?

Answer: Move the cursor a bit. Then the icons appear again.

# [Volume-Turn up / down]

- Can you turn the volume up and down in YouTube ? Answer: Yes, you can
- How do you turn up the volume in YouTube ? Answer: Find the "Volume" icon and click along the bar
- What do you do if you can't see the "Volume" icon ? Answer: Scroll down to find it
- How do you turn down the volume ? Answer: Click along the bar

# [Turn on Closed Captions-CC]

- What is "CC"? **Answer:** It is when the script shows on the screen, and you can read what the speaker says as they are talking.
- How do you show the script? How do you turn on CC?

#### Answer:

- First pause the video
- Find the CC icon and click on it
- Then click on the play icon
- Where is the CC icon? **Answer:** In the bottom right corner of the video

# [Exit Full Screen]

- You are watching a video in full screen. How do you turn off "Full Screen"?
   Answer: Find the "Exit Full Screen" icon and click on it
- Where is the "Exit Full Screen" icon ? **Answer:** In the bottom right corner of the video
- What is another way you can exit full screen? Answer: Press ESC (Escape) on your keyboard

#### Instructions for Tutor:


Then ask the learner: Do you want to watch the video again?

If the learner is struggling, stop the session.

# Say to the learner:

Let's do more work on X before we do this. (so, learner does not feel bad they can't yet do something)

For example, the learner may not be able to recognize cursor shapes or where to place a cursor. If so, go to Module 1 Mouse and Navigating and Module 3 Online Skills Basic etc. to practice the skills with the learner.



#### **Practice-Part Four**

# Instructions for the Tutor: PREPARATION

- Both learner and tutor have a laptop or computer each.
- Make sure there is one internet browser icon on the desktop and/ or the taskbar on learner's computer.

# Preparation for Remote tutoring only:

 Refer to Slides #12 and 13. Tutor should be able to see learner's computer screen and hands.

#### **IMPORTANT:**

The steps on the live YouTube website may be different than in the video lesson and different than the steps in Practice below. This is because websites are constantly changing.

Before the tutoring session, check on YouTube to see if the videos used in this lesson (Save on Foods) are available.

If not, or if you prefer, find another video channel relevant to the learner. If the learner's focus is employment, find one related to that.

If the learner's focus is not employment, find out what the learner is interested in. Look for a good video channel on that topic.

Check also if the steps to do things are the same as in the video lesson.

# Be sure to do the above <u>before</u> the tutoring session!

### **PRACTICE**

Demonstrate first, then let the learner practice.

After each of the following steps, wait for the learner to complete the step. Guide the learner as needed.

### Say to the Learner:

- Now it's time to practice! We're going to practice how to do those functions, like we saw in the video.
  - Make the Video Full Screen
  - Volume- Turn up/down
  - Turn on/ off Closed Captions

# [Go to YouTube]

- Let's start by going to YouTube.
- Now, search for Save on Foods (or another company or group). You did that before. Show me how you do that. (Hint: Use the "Search Bar" at the top)

# [Find the Save on Foods (or another) Channel]

- Ok. Now find a video made by the company and click on it.
- Show me how to do that.
- Great. Now you are in the Save on Foods channel.
- Let's see if a video plays automatically. If it does, pause it.
- How do you pause it ? (Hint: Click on the video or on the pause icon)
- Great. We won't look at the video now. We need to practice the digital skills.

# [Choose a video in "Videos"]

- Now, Go to the menu and choose "Videos".
- Choose a video. Any video is fine. Scroll down if you want to see all of them.
- Play the video. How do you do that ? (Hint: Click on the name or the (video) picture)
- Do that now.

- If an ad plays, pause the video.
- Do you remember how to skip the ad? (Hint: Click on "Skip Ad" icon)
- The video is playing now.
- Pause the video. (Hint: Click on the pause icon/button (or on the video picture)
- Now, let's practice what we saw in the video lesson, how to make the video full screen.

# [Make the Video Full Screen]

- Right now, is the video full screen? No.
- Let's make it full screen. How do you do that? **Answer:** Click on the "Full Screen" icon.
- Where is the "Full Screen" icon? **Answer:** In the bottom right corner of the video screen
- Show me how to do that.
- Great!
- Sometimes the icons disappear. How can you get the icons again? **Answer:** Move the cursor a bit. Then the icons appear again.
- Let's see if that happens..... Yes, they disappeared. So, move the cursor now to see the icons again.
- Now you see them again.

# [Exit Full Screen]

- So, you are watching the video in full screen now.
- How do you turn off "Full Screen" ? Show me.
   (Hint: Find the "Exit Full Screen" icon and click on it)
- Where is the "Exit Full Screen" icon? Answer: In the bottom right corner of the video
- Great.
- What is another way you can exit full screen ? Answer: Press ESC (Escape) on your keyboard
- Let's practice that again! (Have the learner repeat the steps a few times to make the video full screen then exit full screen)

# [Volume-Turn up / down]

- So we saw in the video how you can turn the volume up and down in YouTube.
- How do you turn up the volume in YouTube ? Answer: Find the "Volume" icon and click along the bar
- What do you do if you can't see the "Volume" icon ? Answer: Scroll down to find it
- Show me how to do that now.

- How do you turn down the volume ? Answer: Click along the bar
- · Do that now.
- Let's practice that again! (Have the learner repeat the steps a few times)

### [Turn on Closed Captions-CC]

- In the video we saw how to use CC.
- What is "CC"? **Answer:** It is when the script shows on the screen, and you can read what the speaker says as they are talking.
- How do you use CC to show the script?

# Answer:

- First pause the video
- Find the CC icon and click on it
- Then click on the play icon
- Where is the CC icon? Answer: In the bottom right corner of the video
- Do that now. Show me how to do it.
- Let's practice that again! (Have the learner repeat the steps a few times)

### Instructions for the Tutor:

- Have the learner practice as many times as they need (at least three times.)
- Check the Learner's skills. Has the learner shown you they can do the skills at least three times without support? If so, then they are ready to use the skills on their own!



#### Instructions for the Tutor:

### In-person tutoring and Remote Tutoring:

- Make sure the learner knows how to access the video lesson(s) you just used so they can practice between tutoring sessions.
- If relevant, make sure the support person at home knows how to access the video(s) too.

# **Option One**

 Email the video link to the learner, and if relevant the at-home support person. They can use the link in the email to access the video lesson(s).

# **Option Two**

 Put a link to the specific video lesson(s) you did on the learner desktop so they can access the video easily.

#### How:

- a. Open the website address for the lesson in the browser.
- b. In the address bar, click to highlight the lesson address.
- c. Drag the address (link) onto the desktop. It will make an icon on the desktop.

- d. Find the icon on the desktop and check that the link works.
- e. Show the learner where it is. Tell them to just click to access it for practice.

### **Remote Tutoring Only:**

You can do Strategy Two by using **Request Remote Control** in Zoom during the tutoring session.

Refer to the following for the steps on how to do that:

- Tutor Checklist-During Remote Tutoring Sessions
- Learner Instructions: Let Tutor have Remote Control of your Computer During a Zoom Session
- **IMPORTANT:** Keep in mind the following:
  - Before using Remote Control, be sure to get permission from your organization first.
  - It is crucial that the learner understands what it means, and gives you informed consent.
  - It is somewhat invasive and must be done respectfully and honouring the confidentiality of the learner.
  - Don't use the Request Remote Control feature first! It should be a last resort.
  - First, try your best to teach the learner and the support person how to do things using Share screen and demonstrating.
  - Use it if other ways do not work and the learner really needs to learn digital skills.
  - You may want to record the Zoom tutoring session in case of any possible accusations afterwards.

# Say to the Learner:

- You did well today.
- So, what did you learn and practice today? [only mention the parts you covered]

# [For example: ]

Today, we learned and practiced how to:

- 1. Search for YouTube in the browser
- 2. Search for Videos on YouTube
- It's really important to review and practice as much as you can! Please do

that before our next tutoring session.

- Watch the video again, as many times as you need.
- I've emailed you the link. Let/s make sure you can open it. (OR)
- We've put the link on your desktop. Here it is. Just click on it to watch the video.

Let's make sure it works ok.

# [Practice Plan]

### Preparation

Adapt the following according to what you reviewed in the session.

For example, for Part One of this lesson:

### Say to the learner:

Practice at least three more times before our next session.

Here is what to practice

- I will email you the link to the video lesson
- Open the link and watch the video as many times as you want Then practice the skills.
  - Open the browser and go to the YouTube website.
  - Search for Save on Foods (Or, if you prefer, another company or group that has a YouTube Channel) Use the search bar in YouTube to search.
  - Find only the company videos.
  - Click on one video to go to the company YouTube channel.
  - Check you are in the company YouTube channel.
  - Pause a video if one plays.
  - Then close the browser window.
  - Practice that three times.
  - You can show me at our next session.
  - I will email you this Practice Plan.
  - Please reply to the email so I know you got it and have what you need to do the practice.

[Get learner to confirm they will practice and tell you when. Get specific.]

• When are you going to do the practice? How many times? etc.

### Instructions for the Tutor:

Email the Practice to the learner, and if relevant to the home support person.



### Instructions for the Tutor:

- Confirm the next tutoring session.
- Clarify any support in-between sessions if you are offering that.
   If offering support outside the session time, put boundaries, be clear about when and how you are giving support.

# Say to the Learner.

e.g. Great work today! etc. Let's meet again on X date at X time. Does that work for you? Wonderful.

[If offering support before next session:]

If you need support before our next session, please ........

[For remote support:]
I will send you the Zoom link the day before the tutoring session.
etc.



Bye and see you on X date at X time. Keep practicing!
